Below are 9 tasks linked to the Romans. You can choose any one of the tasks to do in readiness for your studies at RPPC!

Do not feel like you have to limit yourself – you can do more than one if you want to challenge yourself!

Poem / Rap

Write a poem about the Romans. It can be about any aspect of the Roman Empire (army, gladiators, Emperors etc.)



Comic Strip

Design a comic strip telling the story of a major event in Roman history. It should include pictures and text. You could choose:



B- Baths: public place where Romans went to wash and relax


Drama






